Lackawanna Coal Mine Tour: (1 Bald Mountain Ave, Scranton)

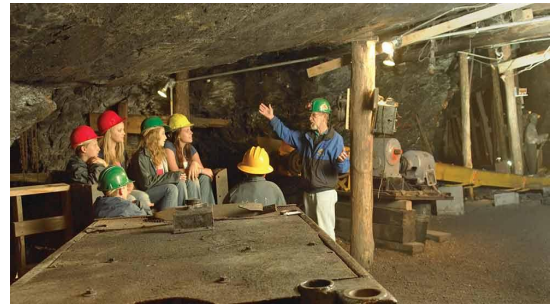
- Explore 300 ft beneath the earth through an anthracite coal mine, originally opened in 1860.
- Visit the **Anthracite Heritage Museum** after at 22 Bald Mountain Road. Similar Rates apply.

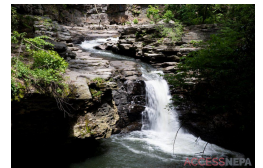

Lakeland Orchard and Cidery (1649 Lakeland Drive Scott Twp.)

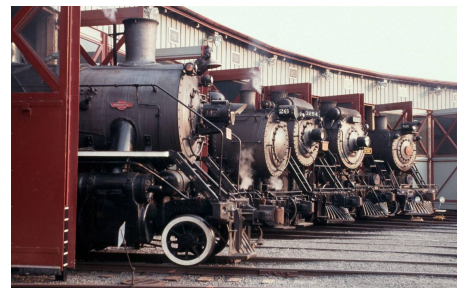

Steamtown National Historic Site: (150 South Washington Ave, Scranton)

- This National Park was created to further public understanding of the role steam railroading played in U.S. development.
- Entrance to the park is FREE
- The park has several guides about the many trains hosted on site, as well as an information desk and gift store.
- **Park Hours:** 9am-5pm 7 days a week



Hikes and Walks

Lackawanna State Park (1839 N Abington Rd, North Abington Twp.)

- Lackawanna State forest offers miles of hiking trails and plenty of other space for biking, kayaking, fishing and camping.



The centerpiece of the park, the 198-acre Lackawanna Lake, is surrounded by picnic areas.

- The park is open every day of the year, sunrise to sunset. **Day use areas close at dusk.**
- The park office is open at specific hours. The pool, overnight areas, and other areas are open at specific seasons and hours. Contact the park office for facility seasons and hours.
